Uniting people who are lesbian, gay, bisexual, transgender, queer, questioning, intersex, and asexual (LGBTQ+) with families, friends, and allies, PFLAG is the nation's largest organization of its kind committed to advancing equality through its mission of support, education, and advocacy. With close to 400 chapters and over 200,000 members crossing multiple generations of families nationwide, this vast grassroots network is cultivated, resourced, and serviced by PFLAG National, located in Washington, D.C. PFLAG is a non-profit organization and is not affiliated with any religious or political institutions.

Vision: PFLAG envisions a world where diversity is celebrated and all people are respected, valued, and affirmed inclusive of their sexual orientation, gender identity, and gender expression.

About Our Speakers

Dirk Correia (he/him) is the GSA Outreach Ambassador for PFLAG Cape Cod and runs his own LGBTQ+ inclusivity training business. He has been working in activism since he was 18 years old. Dirk serves on the boards of Cape & Islands Transgender Resource Fund and Transgender Day of Remembrance and spends his summers working at Harbor Camp for transgender youth. He has dedicated his life to connecting with his community and sharing that with the world.

Sarah Peake (she/her) was elected to the Massachusetts House of Representatives in 2006. This session, Sarah was appointed Second Assistant Majority Leader, by Speaker Mariano. During her 8-term tenure, Sarah has been a vocal and effective advocate for the LGBTQ community. Her work has ensured marriage equality, transgender civil rights, mandated insurance coverage for life-saving AIDS/HIV therapies, supported anti bullying legislation, and created the LGBTQ Aging Commission.

Jeff Hauck (he/him) is an 18-year-old student attending Monomoy High School. He is a talented photographer, filmmaker, and baseball player. Jeff is a transgender man who has been out since the age of nine. He has found community by attending a camp for transgender youth since his childhood, where he has achieved great success in their counselor-in-training program. He is ambitious, outgoing, and intelligent, and, as a current student, it is only fitting that he speaks on this topic today. This is his first speaking engagement and he is excited to share his story.

Julian Cyr (he/him) serves in the Massachusetts Senate representing Cape Cod, Martha's Vineyard, and Nantucket. First elected to the State Senate on November 8, 2016, Julian is now serving in his third term and is among the youngest senators in the 40-member body. He is the Senate Assistant Majority Whip; Chair of the Joint Committee on Mental Health, Substance Use and Recovery; Vice Chair of the Joint Committee on Racial Equity, Civil Rights, and Inclusion; Vice Chair of the Joint Committee on Elder Affairs; and serves on committees with oversight of health care policy, public health, telecommunications and energy, COVID-19 emergency management, and redistricting.

Kimm Topping, Ed.M. (they/them) is an educator, writer, and community organizer who is committed to centering youth voice and leadership. They are the Program Manager for the Safe Schools Program for LGBTQ Students, a joint program of DESE and the MA Commission on LGBTQ Youth. Kimm is currently writing their first full-length book, *GENERATION QUEER*, a young adult book that highlights the stories of 30 LGBTQ+ youth activists.
